

STATEMENT OF PHILOSOPHY

Our Lady's Immaculate Heart Faith Formation supports parents in forming themselves and their youth in the teachings of the Roman Catholic Faith.

The Faith Formation Team (Staff, Catechists & Volunteers) partners with parents—who are the primary catechists of their youth—to implement the six tasks of catechesis, which form adults and youth in:

- Knowledge of the Catholic/Christian faith
- Sacrament and Liturgical (worship) life of Church
- Moral teaching and Conscious formation
- Models & Practice of Prayer
- Community Life
- Mission & Service Outreach to all

Our Lady's Faith Formation process utilizes methods and materials which are approved by our Diocese, in conformity with the Catechism of the Catholic Church, are theologically sound, and educationally & developmentally age appropriate.

7th grade: Introduces a more small-group faith-sharing model used for Edge & Life Teen curricula. They study Pope Saint John Paul II's *Theology of the Body*, including a night for parents, as well as a study of Scripture, particularly the New Testament and how to study/read the Bible. The spring semester is spent studying prayer and being exposed to, and participating, in many different forms of Catholic prayer, both communal and personal.

8th grade: Utilizes both small group and large group lessons, spending the first semester on the Church that Christ founded. In the spring they study the 7 Corporal Works of Mercy and participate in several outreach projects during session time, reinforcing our call as Catholics to serve others.

YDISCIPLE SMALL GROUPS (GRADES 9-12)

Note: 9th through 12th graders meet on specified Wednesdays from 8:15-9:30 pm (normally every other week). Ninth Graders meet at church and Grades 10-12 meet in host homes of parishioners/catechists.

9th grade: Teens build relationship with Jesus, His Church and each other through the use of inquiry and exploration, relating faith to live in practical ways. Alpha Youth materials are utilized for this process.

Participation and regular attendance in 9th Grade is EXPECTED as youth prepare to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation in 10th Grade.

10th grade: Teens grow deeper in their understanding and relationship with Jesus, His Church and each other with an emphasis on the importance of developing and living a prayerful and sacramental life.

11th & 12th grade: Teens begin to "take ownership" of their life-long faith development as they are provided several YDisciple topics to explore at a pace chosen in collaboration with their small group.

Grades 11 & 12 groups have an opportunity to witness to faith by visiting the *On With Life* facility where they participate in a prayer service and interact with the residents.

4th grade: Deepening youth's awareness and understanding of God's love and mercy in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. The Beatitudes and Commandments are presented as guides for living a Christian life. The year includes an extensive unit on the Sacrament of Reconciliation which includes a Dinner/Workshop for parents and their students.

5th grade: Focuses on the rituals and beliefs of Catholicism. The two main units center on the Eucharistic liturgy and the sacraments. In addition, traditions, devotions, seasons, and feasts of the Catholic faith are presented. A *Teaching Mass* for parents and students is offered as part of the curriculum.



PROGRAMS SPECIAL TO ELEMENTARY CURRICULUM:



Prayer Angels: Pre-Kindergarten, Kindergarten, and Grades 1–5 participate in this program. A Prayer Angel is assigned to each group and he/she prays for them throughout the year and sends notes of encouragement and recognition for milestones.

Faith Friends: Grades 2 and 5 are partnered for the year. Students in 5th Grade pray for and write notes of encouragement for the 2nd Graders as they prepare for and receive their sacraments. The 5th Graders also host an Advent Party for their 2nd Grade Faith Friends.

MIDDLE SCHOOL CURRICULUM (GRADES 6-8)

6th grade: Emphasizes a study of the Hebrew Scriptures by focusing on a different person from the books of the Old Testament each week and helping the 6th graders see the connections between the Old Covenant of the Hebrew Scriptures and the New Covenant in Christ. A highlight of the year is the hosting of a modified Seder Prayer Celebration for parents during Holy Week.

REGISTRATION

Registration is open to families who are members of Our Lady's Immaculate Heart Parish.

Registration is completed online at **www.olih.org**. Look for the link at the bottom of the main page under, "Parish Events." (For those without access to a computer, paper forms are available at the parish office.) The registration process helps us organize youth into formation groups efficiently. Please call 515/964-3038 for assistance.

Growing in life-long faith requires youth to be registered for Faith Formation every year.

Placement in session times are made on a **first-come**, **first-available basis**. If a session time is full, a youth may be placed on a waiting list by the age-level director.

Group size is determined by the Faith Formation Staff and is kept small to build community, and allow youth opportunity to participate and grow to their full potential.

GUIDELINES

Where there are two or more sessions of a grade level meeting at one time the following guidelines for youth placement in a particular session is followed:

- 1. Session Director will be the primary decision maker in assigning youth to groups.
- 2. A youth will be placed in the same grade level in the Faith Formation Program as he/she is placed in school.
- 3. In general, brothers/sisters or twins who are in the same grade in school may be placed in the same Faith Formation Session group. Parents are asked to let the Director know if their preference is otherwise.
- 4. In general, requests for particular catechists to teach a youth **can not be honored**.
- 5. In general, requests for a youth to be placed with particular other youth in the same session group can not be honored.

CURRICULUM (PRE K-GRADE 5)

Pre-Kindergarten: (Youth must be 3 years old by September 15) Emphasizes how God cares for us so much that he has given us many gifts including Jesus! Youth learn how to use prayer

and action to thank God. Youth also learn about the parish as their faith Community (family) and how we celebrate our faith through worship, prayer, learning and decision making.

Kindergarten: Focus is on the liturgical year and major celebrations in the church which includes diving more into the sacraments

and Mass. Students learn about the Trinity through breaking the Trinity apart and learning about the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit individually and how we can live like Jesus by listening to Jesus in scripture and following the Saints' examples.

Special Needs: Adapted for the specific grade level needs of the participating child. A focus is given to the four basic pillars of the Catholic faith: worship, prayer, learning and decision making. These concepts are adapted into manageable and age appropriate formats.

1st grade: Emphasizes God's love for us as shown through creation and in the life and ministry of Jesus. Attending 1st Grade is mandatory for a child to celebrate Reconciliation & First Communion in the 2nd Grade.

2nd grade: Preparation for the celebration of the sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist. Emphasis is placed upon the meaning of the sacraments, the relationship between Baptism and Eucharist, the need to live a peaceful life, God's love and forgiveness, the presence of Jesus in the Eucharist and the study of the Mass.

3rd grade: Focuses on the meaning of Church with lessons on the marks of the church, creed, Holy Trinity, sacraments and a review of the Mass. In addition, a unit on forming our conscience and the need to follow the spirit of the Ten Commandments. Youth participate in Hospitality by serving as Hospitality Ministers and serving doughnuts, juice & coffee after Masses (January or February).

Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults, adapted for children This process is designed to provide sacramental preparation and celebration for families and youth who were unable to celebrate the sacraments of initiation (Baptism, First Eucharist and Confirmation) at the usual grade level. This process is open to all ages. The sessions are held on Tuesdays at 5:30 pm. Please contact Patty Mayer, Director of RCIA, patty@olih.org for information.

Youth Ministry:

Our Lady's Youth Ministry is divided

into High School (Grades 9-12) and Middle School (Grades 6-8) and is open to anyone in those grades. These vibrant, active programs offer youth a way to connect to each other through retreats, adventure outings, game nights, bible studies and more. Choirs

Grades 6 - 8 students have a monthly activity planned every 3rd Sunday from 5:30-7:30 pm through the Middle School Ministry component of youth ministry.

Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW):

Open to youth age 3 through 3rd graders during the 10:30 am Mass on specified Sundays. Dates will appear in the bulletin and email updates.

Vacation Bible School:

Offered in June for children entering Kindergarten and going through Grade 5.

ATTENDANCE

Regular attendance is expected and necessary for youth to learn the Christian Faith. Parents are asked to notify the church office if a youth is to be absent. Parents may do this by calling OLIH FF at 515/964-3545 or the parish office, 515/964-3038. Emailing the directors isn't a guarantee that attendance will be recorded before attendance is taken. Perfect attendance awards are given to students in Grades 1-5.

Early Dismissal

If a youth needs to be dismissed from a Faith Formation Session early, parents must notify the FF office prior to their removal. If a youth is absent, and the office has not been notified, every effort will be made to contact parents. Therefore, parents of FF students are asked to complete/update family contact information each year during the registration process.

Early Pick-up

If a youth needs to be picked up early from a Faith Formation Session early, parents **must** get a form from the office and have it signed by an FF Director or Support Volunteer. The parent is to present this signed form to the catechist when taking their youth from session. The parent may be asked to show ID.

Sacrament Preparation

Consistent attendance in a Faith Formation Program for the year prior to and the year of a sacrament is a pre-requisite for celebration of the sacrament.

Session Times

OLIH Faith Formation calendar is based on the *Ankeny School calendar. If the Ankeny schools close due to inclement weather, Faith Formation Sessions are canceled. Cancellation of session times will be aired on local radio and TV stations and sent out online through the OLIH app and Updates.

*Note exceptions: FF classes will be held on the following Mondays when there is no school —October 7, January 20 & February 17.

FEES

Our Lady's Immaculate Heart values supporting families in life-long faith formation. For several years, we have invested approximately \$325/youth enrolled in the faith formation process. This figure is inclusive of all costs associated with life-long faith formation.

To help off-set the cost of the process, a registration fee of \$100.00 per child with a maximum of \$200.00* per family is collected (*assumes no late or other fees). This fee is due at the time of registration. No one will be turned away for financial reasons. Any requests for fee waiver are to be made to the Directors and will be kept confidential.

LATE FEES: A late fee of \$25.00 per family will be charged for any child <u>registered after September 1</u>. This does not apply to families new to the parish.

TRANSFER BETWEEN SESSIONS: After August 31, there is a fee of \$25.00 to transfer youth from the original time registered to another session time. Transfers incur cost on the "back end" and these costs are passed through. In addition, transferring between sessions affects how many sessions are offered and the volunteers that need to be recruited.

Catechists, Volunteer Support Staff & Teen Assistants are not charged a registration fee.

Faith Formation Sessions are held from mid-September through April. (Week after Labor Day thru last day of April)

Social justice activities, such as collecting food and personal care items, visiting *On With Life* and *Catholic Worker House*, are sponsored through the FF program. Youth Ministry offers additional opportunities for 6-12 graders.

An all-program outreach project is planned and carried out each year, often during both Advent and Lent.

Scholarships

Two \$1000 scholarships and one \$500 scholarship are awarded each year from the parish to graduating seniors who have continued through the Faith Formation program of the parish and are active in the faith life of the parish. In addition, students meeting this criteria are also eligible for a number of privately funded scholarships.

Donations and memorials to the OLIH scholarship fund are encouraged and appreciated. Checks can be made payable to *OLIH* and *Scholarship Fund* put in the memo line.

For those who have been confirmed, there are widespread opportunities available in the areas of catechesis, music, liturgy and youth ministry in the parish along with the ability to act as a godparent or sponsor (at 16 years and older).

SPECIAL FEATURES

Our Lady's Immaculate Heart Faith Formation offers many opportunities for youth (including those with special needs) and their families to grow in faith.

Communication:

The Faith Formation Staff utilize multiple means of communication to keep families informed about



curriculum, upcoming events and activities of each grade level. In order to do so, however, it is imperative that each family update or verify (especially their email) contact information annually.

The parish website is a good source of information, www.olih.org

Prayer

All grade level prayer services are held during session times for youth. Youth will learn to serve as lectors, commentators and other ministers for these prayer times during the year.

Liturgical celebrations are held where it is appropriate to the curriculum.

2nd & 4th grade will have an opportunity to learn about and experience the sacrament of Reconciliation.

2nd graders will learn about and celebrate the sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist.

10th graders will have an opportunity to learn about and celebrate the sacraments of Reconciliation and Confirmation.

TRANSPORTATION

Parents assume responsibility for supervision and transportation for their children to and from Faith Formation session times, including immediately following dismissal.

No youth can be permitted to participate in any off-site activity unless the required emergency/permission form has been completed by the parent and/or guardian and is on file at the parish. Off-site activities have adult chaperones present with a one-to-six ratio (1:6).

The Gathering Space entrance doors are to be used as the main drop-off/pick-up point for youth attending Faith Formation sessions. Parents of elementary students are expected to come into the Gathering Space to pick up their youth at dismissal time.

Note: For everyone's safety, access to the drive-through area in front of the Gathering Space will not be permitted. Through the Pave the Way Campaign, fellow parishioners have generously provided plenty of parking.



The West entrance doors are not to be used for the drop-off or pick up of anyone during Faith Formation. These doors will be monitored to prevent this from occurring and are not available for use, during and after Faith Formation sessions.

Using these doors presents a danger due to higher in/out traffic and can become a traffic hazard.

CATECHISTS

Catechists at Our Lady's Immaculate Heart are adult members of the parish who volunteer their time to teach the tenets of Catholicism and to share our faith tradition with our young people.

In addition:

- Youth in grades 8-12 may serve as assistants in the Faith Formation Program at the discretion of the Director.
- Seniors in high school may serve as Catechists if they have completed a year internship with an adult Catechist.
- Youth in Grades 6 & 7 may serve as assistant volunteers in the FF nursery.

Each session will be staffed with two adult Catechists and where appropriate, with an 8-12th grade student assistant.

Catechists have the right to expect adequate training and support for the ministry to which they have been called. In-service workshops are provided on a regular basis to provide Catechists with the skills and theology needed to teach.

Catechists:

- Commit to their own ongoing faith formation
- Attend Mass regularly
- Commit to the entire program year
- Complete a VIRTUS Safe Environment session
- Complete a background check every 7 years

Catechists have the right to register their own children before the general registration. The registration fee is waived for children of Catechists.

A nursery is provided for catechists' children. The FF registration fee is waived for nursery staff.

DISCIPLINE POLICY

In order to provide an environment that promotes maximum learning, good discipline in the room is a necessity. Catechists are **volunteers** and receive basic training in skills that help promote an orderly and structured atmosphere.

When discipline problems arise, it is the practice of the program to attempt to solve them using a Christian Reconciliation Model.

Catechists are encouraged to solve the problems themselves with the help of suggestions from the Director. Catechists are never to call parents directly.

When, despite the attempts of the Catechists, disruptive behavior of a student persists, the Director visits with the student concerning the behavior, the effects and consequences of the behavior, and appropriate solutions.

If disruptive behavior continues a student can be excluded from the room and parents will be contacted by the Director. Parents may be asked to attend session time with their child if inappropriate behavior persists.

If necessary, students will be provided with work to do outside of the room and under the supervision of the Director.

ANTI-HARASSMENT & ANTI-BULLYING

Our program adheres to the **Diocesan Policy F.F. Policy 579**. Harassment and bullying include any electronic, written, verbal, or physical conduct toward a child/youth which is based on any actual or perceived trait or characteristic of the child/youth which creates an objectively hostile faith formation environment.

It is imperative to contact one of the Directors should your student report an incident to you.
